Sub: Violation of Public Procurement Rules 2004, Director Planning & Development,
Directorate of Planning & Development, Civil Aviation Authority Karachi's Pre-
qualification Notice of Project Management Consultants for IIAP.

Dear Sir,

This is with reference to Directorate of Planning & Development, Civil Aviation Authority Karachi's Pre-qualification Notice, published in daily "Dawn" on 9th July, 2014. It is observed that the advertisement is in violation of the Public Procurement Rules 2004.

As per advertisement no pre-qualification documents is issued for the bidders, whereas according to Rule No. 16 (2), it is mandatory to provide a set of prequalification document, and provide detail evaluation criteria to applicants. The Rule is quoted below for your information;

16. Pre-qualification process.- (1) The procuring agency engaging in pre-qualification shall announce, in the pre-qualification documents, all information required for pre-qualification including instructions for preparation and submission of the pre-qualification documents, evaluation criteria, list of documentary evidence required by suppliers or contractors to demonstrate their respective qualifications and any other information that the procuring agency deems necessary for pre-qualification.

(2) The procuring agency shall provide a set of pre-qualification documents to any supplier or contractor, on request and subject to payment of price, if any.

Explanation.- For the purposes of this sub-rule price means the cost of printing and providing the documents only.

The above information is forwarded for the purpose of avoiding the mis-procurement charge under Rule No 50, and with request to re-invite the tender under the prescribed procedures or issue a corrigendum and extend date accordingly.

- Affidavit that the firm has neither been blacklisted nor involved in litigation with any organization.
- A statement indicating the strength of the firm as to why the CAA should consider engaging them as the Project Managers on the IIAP.
- Any other information that may be helpful in pre-qualification of the firm.
- Experience in resolution and settlement of claims.

All consultancy fee shall be payable in Pak Rupees.

The deadline for receipt of applications is 28th July 2014. Applications received after this date shall not be entertained. Only the firms with demonstrated experience in similar assignments will be considered and notified for further participation in the selection process.
