# Protesters attack police post in Swabi

SWABI, Oct 26: The enraged residents of Manki village blocked G.T. Road and tried to attack a police post here on Wednesday to protest what they claimed death of a person due to police torture.

Policemen opened firing on the protesters when they tried to ransack a police post. However, policemen failed to stop the protesters from entering the post despite opening fire on them.

Witnesses said that the enraged villagers, joined by students, retaliated and entered the post to damage belongings of policemen. The protesters demanded judicial inquiry into the incident.

Officials at Sherabad police post said they had arrested Atals Khan and his son Hukam Khan on suspicion of their involvement in a robbery at a utility store outlet on October 17.

They were set free after a former councillor approached police and took them to their home where Atlas Khan died at night.

Hukam Khan alleged that they were interrogated and brutally tortured by police. "Police were demanding Rs25,000 from us for our release," he told journalists.

The villagers placed the body of the victim on Swabi-Jahangira Road and blocked it for six hours to protest the alleged torture by police.

Local students also joined the villagers in their protest and marched towards the police post. Police opened firing on the protesters to stop them from entering the post.

The protesters, some of whom were also armed, retaliated and entered the post where they damaged belongings of the policemen. However, local political leaders rushed to the spot and controlled the enraged protesters.

District Police Officer Mohammad Ejaz Khan, when contacted, said that a judicial inquiry was ordered into the incident to determine the cause of Atlas Khan's death. He said that the entire staff of Sherabad police post was suspended and an FIR was registered on the report of the victim's son Hukam Khan.

Hukam Khan alleged that ASI Farooq Zaman and some policemen tortured them and gave them electric shocks. Marks of violence were visible on the bodies of Atlas Khan and his son. — Muqaddam Khan

raunting private security companies operating in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, directing all district coordination officers and district police officers to keep check on them.

According to a handout issued here on Wednesday, the home and tribal affairs department revoked the licences of defaulting security companies after their failure to renew the same.

"A letter has been sent to all DCOs and DPOs in this regard," the statement said and added that in the present law and order scenario the role of private security companies had enhanced.

At present 55 companies are registered with the home department. These companies are providing security services to various public and private entities.

According to Section 5 of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Private Security Companies Rules, 2003, the DCO and SP concerned may keep a check on private security companies, operating in their jurisdiction.

Section 5 and 8 of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Private Security Companies Ordinance, states that no company can operate without a licence and each of them shall exhibit its licence in a conspicuous place.

Section 11 of the ordinance states that after the revocation of licences the companies shall cease to carry on business. The home department directed the DCOs and DPOs to check the offices of private security agencies and furnish a certificate within 15 days for further necessary action. — Bureau Report

PESHAWAR, Oct 26: Twenty-two of the 200 poor yet talented students from the Federally Administered Tribal Areas and frontier regions have left the country's leading colleges after failing to manage fee with their little federal government scholarship.

These students requested the relevant authorities in the Centre many a time through proper channel for better scholarship following considerable raise in fee by their educational institutions but to no avail, forcing them to enroll themselves in colleges charging low fee.

In 2007, the Provision of Quality Education Opportunities for the Talented Students of Fata and FRs programme was launched on the orders of the then president, Pervez Musharraf.

Under the programme, the federal government was to bear the expenses of 200 students selected for admission to Lahore's Aitchison College, Abbottabad's Army Burn Hall College, Batrasi's Pak Scout Cadet College, Karachi's Pak Steel Cadet College, Bahawalpur's Sadiq Public School, Pataro's Cadet College and Islamabad's Pak-Turk

## Khyber IDPs flay suspension of registration

PESHAWAR, Oct 26: The internally displaced persons from Khyber Agency have criticised the authorities concerned for suspending their registration process at Jalozaï camp.

Addressing a press conference here on Wednesday, Haji Mula Khel, Haji Namdar Khan, Haji Qanaat and Iqbal Afridi said that they had been affected by man-made conflict and military operation for the last three years. "Normal life has been suspended and tribes from Khyber have been forced to leave their homes," they said.

They said that not only Sipah and Malikdinkhel but other tribes like Akkakhel, Shalubar, Qambarkhel and Zakhakhel were also living in the areas where military operation was launched few days ago.

"All of them should be provided shelter and other relief items without any discrimination," they demanded. The elders said that Provincial Disaster Management Authority suspended the registration process on Tuesday, leaving many displaced families in lurch. They said that IDPs of Khyber Agency should be assisted and sent back to their homes like those of Malakand, who were not only repatriated in the shortest possible time but also provided financial assistance to restart their lives.

The tribal elders said that they had not seen any undeserving or ineligible person, who tried to get himself registered. "So suspension of registration process on this pretext is only a lame excuse to deprive IDPs of assistance," they alleged.

They said that government should not allot tents and other relief items of the IDPs, already taking shelter in the camp, to the newly displaced persons from Khyber as it created animosity among the people of the same area. They also criticised government for getting funds from donors in the name of IDPs but depriving the deserving ones of what it got in their name.

"The government forced us to leave our homes so it is responsible for taking care of us," they said. They demanded that they should be registered without any discrimination and provided with shelter, food, health and education facilities.
