
However, the complainant has again informed TIP that in all the four provinces the illegal use of Govt. vehicles by retired police officers, in some cases even after 7-8 years of their retirement, is continuing, and no action has been taken by any Chief Minister.

The Chief Minister of Balochistan is requested to kindly take notice of complaint, so that action is taken to stop the illegal use of govt. vehicle.

According to NAO 1999, this act is declared as Corrupt Practice under Article 9, and punishable under Article 10. Transparency International Pakistan requests you to kindly take immediate action and order suspension of this illegal act, and recovery of expense incurred from the pension of those officers misusing govt. vehicles.

Transparency International Pakistan has received a complaint that hundreds of retired senior officers of police are illegally retaining official police department vehicles, SUVs with govt. paid drivers and fuel and maintenance facilities, even after retirement.

Neotism is at its highest in this illegal act, as the seniors viz. IG and CCPO though they are in knowledge of this malpractice, and do not take action against this. As they are also nearing retirement and would like to avail this illegal benefit at the exchequer cost.


This illegal practice and looting by police officers is going on for decades.

This illegal act is not only causing billions of rupees loss to the exchequer, but also increasing the grievances of the citizen of Pakistan, who are witness of this illegal act and know that, Law enforcement Police is misusing it for personal gain.
