Sub: Violation of Sindh Public Procurement Rules 2010, Project Coordinator, Community Development Department, Planning and Development Program, Karachi's Tender Notice for Community Projects Works.

Dear Sir,

This is with reference to Planning and Development Program, Karachi's Tender Notice, published in daily "Dawn" on 28th July, 2016. It is observed that the advertisements are in violation of the Sindh Public Procurement Rules 2010.

As per advertisement, Planning and Development Program, Karachi reserves the right to accept reject any or all project proposals with or without assigning any reason. It is violation of Sindh Public Procurement Rules 2010, Rule No. 25. Stated as under;

25. Cancellation of Bidding Process (4) The procuring agency shall, upon request by any of the bidders, communicate to such bidder, grounds for the cancellation of bidding process, but is not required to justify such grounds;

The above information is forwarded for the purpose of avoiding mis-procurement charge under Rule No 32(A), and with request to re-invite the tender under the prescribed procedures or issue a corrigendum and extend date accordingly.

Transparency International Pakistan is striving for across the board application of Rule of Law, which is the only way to stop corruption.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BOARD PLANNING & DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT GOVERNMENT OF SINDH CALL FOR PROPOSALS (Phase-VI, 2016)

The Program Coordinating Unit, Community Development Program (PCU, CDP) hereby invites proposals for its Phase-VI funding of community based projects to be implemented by registered Civil Society Organizations. The proposed projects must be community driven and should address priority needs amongst under-served communities of hard and far flung areas of Sindh, specially where the government sector has not been able to reach out so far.

SECTORS / FIELDS OF INTERVENTION:

- **Education**
Preferably:
Capacity building of schools & students (govt. & non-govt)
- **Health**
Preferably:
Provision of Mother & Child Health Care Centers in all the districts of Sindh.
- **Skill Development & Women Empowerment**
Preferably:
Capacity building and provision of sustainable livelihood to under-privileged women / youth of poverty ridden areas like Umerkot, Tharparkar, Kashmore, Kamber, Jacobabad, Dadu, Jamshoro, Mirpur Khas (except Tehsil headquarters), Thatta, Badin, Sanghar.
- **Water & Sanitation**
Preferably:
Sanitation facilities and hand pumps in those districts where intervention has not been undertaken before like Jacobabad, Ghotki, Badin, Thatta and Kashmore.
- **Legal Aid**
Restricted to:
Financial Assistance to the poor for payment of Court / Advocate Fees for their cases on the recommendation of District Prosecutors / others in all Districts of Sindh, through CSOs.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

- List of similar works completed during last 5 years
- Audit Reports of last three years, conducted by a registered External Audit Firm.
- Preference will be given to those CSOs who are PCP Certified.
- Be directly responsible for the preparation and management of the Project and not acting as an intermediary.
- Certificate of registration with relevant legal and professional bodies and also approved from Government of Sindh, Social Welfare / Industries Department
- Two or more CSOs can pool their expertise under a consortium by assigning lead role to one CSO.
- Capable enough to directly prepare, manage and execute the Project. NO subletting is allowed
- Application received without original Pay Order will not be considered.
- Preference will be given to those CSOs which have remained involved with CDP in last phases and have completed their work satisfactorily on time.
- Need Assessment / baseline survey should be made part of the Technical proposal which would be evaluated / verified by site visit as well.
- The CSO/NGO should not be Black List with Government of Sindh
- In CSO of consortium lead also will be assessed on above eligibility criteria.

FINANCING LIMITS:

- The proposals less than two (2) Million or more than thirty (30) Million Rupees (exclusive of CSOs' own contribution) will not be considered except in rare conditions.

PROCEDURE FOR SUBMISSION OF PROPOSALS:

- Applicant CSOs are requested to submit a 02 sealed envelopes indicating the sector / field of intervention and their contact details. This sealed envelope must contain:
 - ❖ Technical Proposal
 - ❖ Financial Proposal (Separately sealed)
 - ❖ Filled in "Concept Application Form" (downloadable from the website of CDP <http://www.pcudp@gos.pk/eois.php> or obtained from the office of CDP, free of cost).
- The Financial Proposals will be opened only when the Concept Proposal is approved.
- Those applying in more than one sectors / fields must submit their Application Forms in separate envelopes
- Each Application Form MUST be accompanied with an original Pay Order of Rs. 1000/- (non-refundable) in favour of Project Coordinator, PCU-CDP.

SELECTION METHOD:

- The selection of proposals will be through transparent and merit based process by Members of the Community Development Board supported by PCU.
- Any major error or discrepancy related to the points listed in the instructions on the Concept Application Form may lead to the rejection of the Concept Application Form.
- Clarifications will only be sought when information provided is unclear.
- The CSOs are advised not to offer technical proposals of urban / metropolitan areas.
- The Competent Authority reserves the rights to accept or reject any or all project proposals with or without assigning any reason.

CLOSING DATE:

- The Proposals as per above guidelines must be dropped in the designated Drop Box at PCU or received through Courier at the PCU, CDP at the address given below on or before Tuesday, 30th August, 2016 by 4:00 p.m (A signed and dated receipt will be given to the deliverer).

NOTE:

The shortlisted CSOs will be required to abide by the Sindh Public Procurement Regulatory Authority Rules, 2010 for all kinds of procurements which will be made through a procurement Committee comprising Members of both CSO and CDP.
