Sub: Verification by NESPAK that 70% to 80% development works in the Contracts worth Rs. 20 billion awarded by DHA on EOIB Plots and Villas.

Dear Sir,

A copy of letter sent to Acting Secretary, Ministry of Water and Power, dated 16<sup>th</sup> August 2013 is enclosed for your perusal also.

It is in your knowledge that unsolicited contracts cannot be awarded under Public Procurement Ordinance 2002, as its amount to corruption due to possibility of giving contracts at two to three times more than the market prices.

You were the petitioner in the RPP case on the same grounds, and Supreme Court on 30<sup>th</sup> March 2012 had declared all such RPP's contract void ab-initio and illegal, as the power generation rates of one of the unsolicited contract were as high as Rs. 42 per unit.

TI-Pakistan expects from you the same principal of application of rule of law, as the Minister of Water and Power, and request to make all officers accountable, who were involved in illegal works, in Ministry of Water & Power in last 10 years.

TI-Pakistan requests you to take interest in Nespak report case, and hold an inquiry, so that the matter may be cleared as soon as possible, and violator of Law are made accountable by your goodself.

Transparency International Pakistan is striving for across the board application of Rule of Law, which is the only way to stop corruption.
