Transparency International Pakistan refers to your letter no. 34-ITM/DS(IA-2)/13 dated 3rd July 2013, regarding confirmation of an undated letter allegedly written by some Mr. Muzaffar Javed, as Coordinator of Transparency International Pakistan to Secretary to the Prime Minister.

This is to inform the Prime Minister Secretariat that this letter is fraud and forgery by unknown element. Previously a similar letter was written to Secretary to the Prime Minister, which was also confirmed as fraudulent by the undersigned on 27th June 2013 (Annex-A).

The Prime Minister Secretariat is requested not to consider any letter written by Transparency International Pakistan by any other person except Mr. Syed Adil Gilani, Chairman Advisory Committee TIP, who is the only authorized person, assigned the responsibility by the Board of Trustee of Transparency International Pakistan.


- 1) 1. Software and ERP system for Federal Ministry of Interior
2. Software and ERP system for Chief Commissioner office Islamabad
3. Software and ERP system for Islamabad Police
4. Software and ERP system for Islamabad Traffic Police
5. Software and ERP systems for Police stations of Islamabad
6. Software and ERP System for Revenue Department of Islamabad
7. Software and ERP system for Excise and Taxation department
8. Software and ERP systems for all departments and services of ICT
9. Land Record Computerization system

But, unfortunately after spending many years, neither E-Government department nor Ministry of IT made any success. The said software systems were never implemented in Ministry and/or its subsidiaries. Hence money of poor tax payers drowned in the ocean of corruption and poor management.
